The 18th International Conference(POST ISCBC-2012)

The 18th International Conference(POST ISCBC-2012) was held in the campus of Institute of Advanced Study in Science & Technology (IASST), Guwahati, Assam, an autonomous Institute under Dept. of Science & Technology, Govt. of India under the aegis of Indian Society of Chemists and Biologists, Lucknow on the theme "Perspectives and Challenges in Chemical & Biological Sciences: Innovation Cross Roads" from 28 -30th January 2012. This conference was organized by IASST for the first time in the North Eastern Region. In the three-day conference more than 450 participants from all parts of India and North East and countries like USA, UK, Italy, Greece, Egypt and Australia took part in this mega event. Majority of the participants were young people who presented more than 350 posters highlighting their research work.

The conference was inaugurated by His Excellency the Hon'ble Governor of Assam, Sri Janaki Ballav Patnaik. Sri Tarun Gogoi, Chief Minister of Assam, holding the Science & Technology Portfolio also graced the occasion as the Guest of Honour in the inaugural ceremony, released the Souvenir of the Conference and addressed the more than seven hundred people gathered in the pandel. Sri Gogoi expressed his happiness for inviting this prestigious conference to Guwahati by IASST for the first time as this will give an opportunity to the scientists, researchers, teachers to interact with the eminent scientists coming from different parts of the world. The Chief Minister in his address told that Healthy Nation means healthy people and appeal to the scientists for working for developing affordable drugs to the poor and common man. He also stressed on working on the traditional system of remedies and herbal medicines, which are cheap and having less side effects. He even told that he himself also use the herbal medicines.

Dr. T. Ramasami, Secretary, Dept. of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, who is also the Chairman of the Governing Council of IASST and also the Chief Petron of the Organizing committee of the Conference also addressed the gathering of scientists students etc on this occasion. He opined that India is no longer under developed in respect of Scientific developments and there is no dearth of young talents in India, he said. He released the Scientific Abstract book of the Conference.

Prof. Joyanti Chutia, Director of IASST delivered the welcome address and informed briefly about the activities of the Institute. Dr. Jibon Kotoky, Convener of the conference offered the vote of thanks in the inaugural ceremony of the Conference.
